paper and screw and getting the space down to the original four walls and floor.

- 2 As you're removing the items, organize them into categories or zones.
- **3** Tranform the space into a beautiful extension of your home and you're more likely to take care of it and maintain the organized version.
- 4 Use a pegboard along the wall, painted in your favorite color. Use it to hang all of your tools, gardening items, brooms, mop, etc... from. That way, everything has a place and it's much easier to put it back in the same place over and over again.
- 5 Hang up artwork or have your children create something to hang on the wall as a focal point.

Now, for this couple (and their two kids) it took one entire day and ten people to get the job done. Here are final tidbits of advice she had for us regular folk.
